

# Extra Curricular & Events Policy 2025/26

#### 1. Introduction

At Al Rabeeh Academy, we believe that extracurricular activities (ECAs) and events play a vital role in nurturing students' wellbeing, confidence, and talents. They provide opportunities for students to develop socially, emotionally, physically, and academically.

Al Rabeeh Extra Curricular Activities can be classified into three categories; Wellbeing, Innovation & Creativity and Academics. All teaching staff and available teaching assistants are encouraged to offer an ECA each term to ensure that all students' needs are catered for across the school cycles. Activity registrations are reset at the beginning of each term to allow students to experience a range of activities across the school year.

This policy outlines how ECAs and events will be provided safely, inclusively, and in compliance with Abu Dhabi Department of Education and Knowledge (ADEK) requirements. It applies to all students, parents, and staff involved in extracurricular life at our school.

## 2. Aims and Purpose

Through this policy, Al Rabeeh Academy will:

- Offer a broad range of activities that support students' academic, cultural, artistic, athletic, intellectual, and philanthropic growth.
- Ensure safe and inclusive participation for all students, including those with additional learning needs.
- Foster student wellbeing, creativity, teamwork, and leadership.
- Provide clear guidance for parents, staff, and students on how ECAs and events are planned, approved, and delivered.

#### Lifelong Friendships

Creates lasting bonds and friendships that extend beyond the school years.

Encourages collaboration and support among peers.

# Parental Involvement

Engages families in school activities, fostering a supportive community.

Strengthens the partnership between home and school.

#### Fun and Enjoyment

Provides a break from academic pressures, allowing students to enjoy their school experience.

#### 3. Extracurricular Provision

#### 3.1 Range of Activities

- Activities will include academic clubs, sports, arts, cultural events, student leadership opportunities, and charitable initiatives.
- A number of activities will be offered free of charge, especially those led by school staff or volunteers.
- Additional paid activities may be offered, subject to ADEK approval and reasonable fee structures.

Activities are led by experienced ADEK approved Al Rabeeh staff members and ADEK approved third party coaches and supervision ratios are inline with ADEK requirements. All activity providers have read and are aware of the ADEK Student Protection policy.

#### 3.2 Access and Inclusion

- All students are encouraged to participate, regardless of ability, gender, or background.
- Adjustments will be made where necessary to ensure students with additional learning needs are included.
- Students may propose new ECAs with approval from the Principal.

# 3.3 Scheduling

Extra Curricular Activities run directly after the school day and the vast majority are free to attend for Al Rabeeh Students. The termly activity schedule is coordinated with School leaders and agreed upon. Students and parents are invited to feedback regarding preferences for additional activities each term. Key stage 4 & 5 students are invited to lead or assist in after school activities as part of their personal development.

Activity registrations are made via the schools OKRA portal booking system, available to all parents and students. Schedules are shared with parents and students via the official communication channels. All registered students are expected to act in accordance with the School Codes of Conduct and adhere to the ADEK student behaviour policy.

- ECAs will be scheduled to minimise disruption to lessons. Some may run after school, during weekends, holidays, or school breaks, with ADEK approval.
- A full ECA calendar will be shared with parents and published on the school communication channels.

# 4. Roles and Responsibilities

# 4.1 ECA Coordinator(s)

The school will appoint one or more staff members as ECA Coordinators to:

- Oversee the ECA programme and calendar.
- Approve risk assessments and emergency plans.
- Ensure compliance with ADEK policies.
- Communicate regularly with parents, staff, and students.

# 4.2 ECA Supervisors

Every ECA will have a Supervisor who:

- Has appropriate qualifications/experience.
- Ensures student safety and wellbeing during the activity.
- Completes required risk assessments and incident reports.
- Complies with ADEK's Student Protection, Health and Safety, and Behaviour policies.

# 4.3 Parents

Parents are expected to:

- Provide signed consent for each ECA, trip, or event.
- Share relevant medical/emergency information.
- Ensure timely pick-up/drop-off of children.

# 5. Planning and Safety

# 5.1 Risk Management

- All ECAs, trips, and events will have a risk assessment and emergency plan.
- Adequate adult supervision ratios will be maintained:
- FS-Y2: 1 adult per 6 students
- Y3-Y7: 1 adult per 10 students
- Y8+: 1 adult per 15 students
- Students with additional needs: 1 adult per 3 students (or higher if required)
- Overseas trips: 1 adult per 8 students

#### 5.2 Transportation

- School transport for ECAs will follow ADEK's Transportation Policy.
- Only approved transport providers will be used, with appropriate safety equipment and supervision.

#### 5.3 Health and Wellbeing

- First aid provisions will be available at all ECAs and events.
- Food provided during ECAs will meet ADEK's Healthy Eating and Food Safety Policy.

#### 6. Events

- Events may include sports days, National Day celebrations, cultural performances, competitions, and graduation ceremonies.
- All events will:
- Be planned in line with ADEK cultural and health/safety requirements.
- Require parental consent for student participation.
- Include clear behaviour expectations for all attendees.
- Graduation ceremonies will be free of charge, with no requirement for parents to purchase additional materials.
- Photography at events will only take place with prior parental approval.

# 7. Trips and Exchange Programmes

- Field trips require ADEK approval and parental consent. Participation is optional.
- Overseas trips will only be offered from Year 6 upwards (with exceptions for gifted students). These will include travel insurance and follow UAE Ministry of Foreign Affairs guidance.
- Exchange programmes (inbound and outbound) will be approved in line with ADEK rules, with clear responsibilities shared between parents and the school.

# 8. Parental Consent

Parents must provide signed consent for their child to participate in any ECA, event, or trip. Consent forms will include:

- Purpose, schedule, and location of the activity.
- Transportation arrangements.
- Supervisors' contact details.
- Emergency and medical information.

# 9. Records and Accountability

The school will maintain records of:

- Student attendance at ECAs.
- Risk assessments, emergency plans, and consent forms.
- Incident reports (submitted through ADEK's reporting systems where required).
- All external providers and associated approvals.

Non-compliance with this policy may result in ADEK intervention or legal accountability.

# **10. Communication with Parents**

- This policy will be available on the school website and in parent and student handbooks.
- Regular communication will include:

- ECA calendars and updates.
- · Event invitations.
- Safety and consent requirements.

#### 11. Review of Policy

This policy will be reviewed annually to ensure alignment with ADEK updates and the needs of our school community.

# Al Rabeeh Academy's Extra Curricular Program

At Al Rabeeh Academy the aim of our ECA programme is to enrich students' educational experience. We aim to create opportunities for every student by varying the activities between academic and non-academic. Many of the activities on offer will support a healthy lifestyle, increasingly important to the wellbeing of the students.

The Al Rabeeh Academy ECA programme consists of activities over 4 days, Monday to Thursday. Monday and Thursday ECA's are teacher-led activities, which we refer to as internally provided activities, in which we aim to provide our students with a chance to interact with their teachers away from the classroom environment. We are also using external local providers to offer our students additional physical activities in Gymnastics, Keyboard, Karate, Jiu jitsu, & Maestros Football. These externally provided activities will require additional payment to participate.
